



PRAYING FOR YOUR HUSBAND: WEEK 1

Monday: Pray for him to put God above all things in his life. (Matthew 5:6)

Lord, I pray first and foremost for my husband's relationship with You. That he knows who You are and that dictates his view of himself. That he reads and knows Your Word and lives it out. That he hears Your voice and follows after You in obedience. That he is able to correctly prioritize all things in his life in placing you first, above me and our family.

Tuesday: Pray for his heart. (Exodus 20:3)

God, I pray for my husband's heart. That it would be full of compassion. That his heart would remain soft toward You and others. That he would not grow cold or cynical from anything that has happened to him or from what goes on in the world. But that he would be someone who people see as hopeful. That his heart would reflect Your heart, God. I pray that you would help my husband to recognize idols in his life, including me, his work, his family, etc. and that you would give him the wisdom to not succumb to them.

Wednesday: Pray that the working of his hands will be blessed. (Psalm 1:3)

Lord, I thank you for gifting my husband with the ability to work and provide for our family. I pray that he will be blessed in his workings and that he will find great joy in being present in his each work day.

Thursday: Pray for his protection in all things. (Psalm 32:7)

Lord, I pray that you will protect my husband from accidents, that you will shield him from illnesses, and that you will shelter him from evil.

Friday: Pray that God would lead your husband to Godly friendships. (Proverbs 13:20, Psalm 27:17)

Lord, I pray that my husband would choose his friends wisely. I pray that You will bring him men that will encourage his accountability to You and will not lead him into sin.



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Saturday: Pray that he will be quick to confess and repent of sin. (Psalm 51:1-2, 1 John 1:9, James 5:16)

Lord, bring conviction in my husband's life and allow him to know when he has sinned against you. Guide him to a time of confession and repentance to you. And help him to be humble enough ask forgiveness where forgiveness is needed.

Sunday: Pray that he will love righteousness and hate wickedness. (1 Corinthians 10:12-13)

Lord, I pray that my husband will have clear eyes to recognize the evilness around him and that he will choose to not participate in its actions, but rather take a strong, clear stand against evil.

PRAYING FOR YOUR WIFE: WEEK 1

Monday: Pray that God would increase her passion for Him and His Word. (Deuteronomy 6:5)

Lord, I pray that you increase her hunger for your word. Grow her passion for you and your ways and help her to see people the way you see them today. Give her a new and fresh desire to seek you and serve you.

Tuesday: Pray for her to put aside all idols. (Exodus 20:3)

Lord, I ask you to help her put you first in everything she does. Guide her to see those everyday idols of family (including me), work, money, time, image, etc. and give her the wisdom to not succumb to them.

Wednesday: Pray that God would intensify her joy. (Nehemiah 8:10, 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18, Galatians 6:9)

Lord, remind my wife today that the joy of the Lord is the source of her strength. Help her to see the world through the lens of thankfulness and to see your hand at work. Help her to choose joy today in both the big things and little things. Protect her from growing discouraged in doing what you have called her to do today.

Thursday: Pray that God would affirm her beauty. (Psalm 139:14)

Lord, help my wife to see herself the way you see her. Help her to know that you look at her as your precious daughter and you delight in her. Encourage her with the fact that she has been uniquely created by you and for you. If you hear her comparing herself to others, remind her of Psalm 139:14.

Friday: Pray that God would grow your wife's friendships. (Colossians 3:12-14)

Lord, I ask you to increase her connection with women who would help her to grow closer to you. Bring new friends into her life as well. I ask you to bring friends that she can feel comfortable talking about accountability issues with. I ask you to bring friends that she can pray and study your word with. I also ask you to remove any unhealthy friendships she has.

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Saturday: Pray that she will be quick to confess and repent of sin. (Psalm 51:1-2, 1 John 1:9, James 5:16)

Lord, bring conviction in her life and allow her to know when she has sinned against you. Guide her to a time of confession and repentance to you. And help her to be humble enough ask forgiveness where forgiveness is needed.

Sunday: Ask God to fill her with His Spirit. (Ephesians 5:18, Galatians 5:22-23)

Lord, I am thankful for the seal of the Holy Spirit on her life. I ask you today for more. I ask you to fill her afresh with the presence and power of the Holy Spirit. Lead her to new places in your presence. Pour a fresh anointing on her to live out her calling and grow the fruit of your Spirit.



PRAYING FOR YOUR KIDS: WEEK 1

Monday: Deuteronomy 6:4-9, Joshua 24:14-15

Heavenly Father, thank you for entrusting me with the children you have given me. As parents, give us an understanding of Your Word and help us to teach the scriptures diligently to our children, talking about them when we are at home, when we go to work or school, when we go about our day, when we go to bed at night, and when we wake up. Father, I pray that our whole family would choose to serve you in sincerity and faithfulness all the days of our lives.

Tuesday: Isaiah 64:8, Psalm 103:13, Romans 8:15-17

God, I pray that my child's identity would be first and foremost established as Your child. I pray you will reveal Yourself to them and that they would know You as their Father in Heaven. Help them to understand their desperate need for You and how much You love them. Help them learn to lean on and depend on You in a relationship, not in their strength, works, or religious rules. Help them to know and understand that You love them with an everlasting, unconditional love, and they can run to you with anything they are struggling with.

Wednesday: James 4:7, Matthew 6:13, Romans 8:11

God, I pray that my child's identity would be firmly anchored and rooted in Christ alone, as a son or daughter of God, and that their ears would be deaf to the deceptive voices of this world that would try to label them with counterfeit identities. Jesus, I pray that they would not cave to peer pressure and sin. Help them to resist the devil, flee from temptation, and stay strong in You. Strengthen them through Your Spirit that lives in them. Thank you that you do not allow them to be tempted beyond what they can bear.

Thursday: Psalm 119:11, Philippians 3:20-21, Matthew 6:10

Father, give my kids a love for Your word, and I pray they would store it up in their hearts. I pray that they would have a revelation of their Kingdom status as citizens of Heaven and new creations in Christ Jesus and live according to that belief. Your Kingdom come, Your will be done, on earth in my child's life as it is in Heaven.

Friday: Galatians 2:20
